- Community Service & Involvement
- School Participation
- 2.5 GPA or Higher
- Financial Need
- Likelihood of Future Success in Academics or Vocational Pursuits

All applicants must complete the attached application and include your most recent transcript. A letter of recommendation is also required. The letter should clearly indicate the name and occupation of the individual who wrote the letter of recommendation, as well as the nature of their relationship to you. In addition to answering the questions on the application, please provide a brief autobiographical statement including why you expect to succeed in school and in life.
